Volunteer 2025 Summit

On November 8, the inaugural Volunteer Summit brought nearly 100 community leaders together at NSCC Bridgewater for a day dedicated to strengthening volunteerism across Lunenburg and Queens Counties.

Born from a 2024 survey of local volunteer groups, the Summit was created through Project Volunteer — an inter-municipal partnership working to support and reinvigorate volunteer efforts throughout our region.



The day opened with a powerful keynote from Max Chauvin, The Power of Local: Reigniting Volunteerism in Rural Communities, which set an energizing tone for what followed. Participants took part in two thought-provoking group sessions: Don't Just Recruit Volunteers, Let's Build a Community with Volunteer Nova Scotia, and Welcoming Newcomers: Engaging Through Volunteerism, featuring firsthand experiences from newcomers who now call our communities home.



Attendees also chose from a wide range of breakout workshops, diving into practical topics such as grant writing, bookkeeping, fundraising, social media, re-imagining community facilities, and collaborative approaches to supporting volunteers.



Along with a full day of learning, participants enjoyed lunch, refreshments, door prizes, and the excitement of the grand draw — with the \$500 prize going to the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 23 in Lunenburg.



Thank you to everyone who joined us and helped make the 2025 Volunteer Summit a celebration of the people who help our communities thrive. Your energy, ideas, and commitment continue to shape a stronger future for all of us.

Food and Grocery Pantry Opens in Hubbards

Through the Years Early Learning Centre proudly celebrated the grand opening of its new **Food & Grocery Pantry** on Monday, October 20th, with approximately **25 community members** in attendance. The event marked an exciting new initiative for the organization and for families in the Hubbards area.

"We're thrilled by the turnout and the kindness shown by everyone who came," said **Mary Ellen Shatford, Director of Through the Years Early Learning Centre.**

"This pantry is truly a community effort —born from a shared desire to support one another and ensure that no family in our area has to go without the essentials. Every donation, big or small, helps make a real difference."

The Food & Grocery Pantry will provide access to nutritious food and non-food essentials for families in the area. It will rely on the ongoing generosity of individuals, businesses, and local organizations to keep its shelves full.

In her opening remarks, Mary Ellen thanked donors and community partners who helped make the pantry a reality. "To launch the pantry, we received help from the United Way Maritimes with an Urgent Food & Essentials Fund grant and a council grant committed from Councilor Clarissa Coolen. We also thank Scott Reinhardt and his staff at Interhabs for building and donating the pantry, and Dave Waters at Metaline Graphics for making and donating the signage."

Donations of non-perishable food and non-food essentials are now being accepted at **20 Pte. Richard Green Lane, Hubbards**. Financial contributions are also welcome to help sustain operations. Donation bins are also located at Hubbards Chiropractic and The Savary Plate.

This Pantry is open twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. The pantry at Through the Years does not replace the Hubbards Food Bank that has operated in the area for many years. If the needs of a family exceed what this small pantry can provide, we encourage families to reach out to the Hubbards Food Bank by dialing 211.


