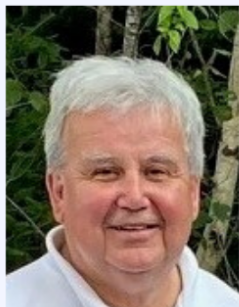
ARE WE READY?

If the level of development along Hwy 103 is any indication, this region is in for some significant changes over the next few years. Whether we like these changes or not, we all have to prepare for what is coming. In the past, as a community we have held a series of planning meetings to try and get ahead of the development we knew was inevitable, and now that it is on our doorstep, the question is, are we ready?

As a community we have requested zoning to protect the public process required for development, we have advocated for sidewalks and better trail access, we have supported the establishment of a streetscape plan and we identified the need for standardized signage projects to create a sense of community and reduce the clutter at the entrance to the region. While we cannot always control the pace of development in the way we would like, we can continue to have a say in the region by participating in public meetings and information sessions.

One such meeting is taking place on **December 10 from 6-8** at the Hubbards Area Lions Club. It is hosted by the Municipality of the District of Chester, regarding the Coastal Regulations. More information about this can be found on page 3 of this edition.

At the end of the day it is the beauty of this region that keeps people here and coming back. To build upon that community quality, **the AHT is looking for input into a new beautification strategy for the area.** To start, we will work with the Municipality of Chester and take advantage of a new funding program available to create a number of lower cost/high impact projects that can take place in and around the commercial area of Hubbards (from the trailhead to the Fox Point Front Rd). AHT is looking for ideas and suggestions about what we could do to help improve the outdoor amenities and create places where people can gather and enjoy what the community has to offer. This will be an ongoing project so don't be afraid to share projects big or small. We expect this work will be expanded in future years so would appreciate knowing your ideas for the future, as well.

Grants

These cover both community events and larger community development and infrastructure projects. Applications from individuals or businesses are not accepted. Scholarships

The Aspotogan Heritage Trust is pleased to provide scholarships to graduating students from Forest Heights Community School and Bay View High School who are attending post-secondary studies at the University and College level. Two \$500 scholarships are awarded to each school annually. AHT provides scholarships to students that meet the following criteria:

- Student must reside in the communities between and including East River to Black Point
- Student must provide a current transcript, a reference letter and a personal essay about their community and school involvement.

Municipality of Chester Coastal Regulations: Public Engagement



Municipal Council has asked staff to host a series of community meetings to provide information on coastal threats (erosion, flooding & loss of sensitive coastal wetlands). Staff are seeking input and comments from community members to assist in creating a draft set of regulations that would ensure development on or near the coast is done responsibly and safely. Regulations would also provide protection for sensitive coastal ecosystems. You can play an important role in developing these rules by providing input and comments.

Three meetings have been scheduled throughout November and December. **Anyone** is welcome to attend one or more of the meetings (the material presented will be the same at each meeting). Each meeting will be open from 6:00–8:00pm. The format will be Open House, with attendees welcome to come and go as they wish.

- **November 13, 2025:** Western Shore—Western Shore Legion (6582 Highway 3, Western Shore)
- **November 24, 2025:** Village of Chester—Tuck Hall (54 Regent Street, Chester)
- **December 10, 2025:** Hubbards — Hubbards Area Lions Club (43 Lions Club Rd, Fox Point)

Following these sessions staff will return to Council before draft regulations are created. These draft regulations will then be made available to the public for review with time to provide feedback and comment. Council will then schedule a Public Hearing to vote on the draft regulations for coastal development

Community kindness shines bright in our region, embodied by two inspiring local initiatives: Purses with Purpose and Patchwork Pals. Both show how small acts of care can ripple through our neighborhoods and make meaningful difference in many lives.

Purses with Purpose Project

Purses with Purpose is all about creativity, compassion, and supporting women through transitional times. Founded by a dynamic mother-daughter team, the project transforms repurposed jeans into unique, hand-made totes, each filled with personal-care items meant to say “you matter.” These gifts are much more than practical—they offer dignity, encouragement, and a sense of belonging.

Getting involved is easy and deeply rewarding. Community members can host a “jean drive” to gather material, join a tote-making pop-up, volunteer their time, or donate personal-care essentials like feminine hygiene supplies, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and toothbrushes. Every contribution—whether chopping belt-loops, sewing seams, or dropping off donations—fuels the spirit of care that defines the project.

Patchwork Pals

Patchwork Pals keeps the creativity and kindness flowing with their beautiful “Comfort quilts.” This small but mighty group—including Peggy Conrad, Sharon Legge, Jane Ramey, Kandance Laurendeau, Vida Doucette, Bev Kenyon, and Kate Burke—meets every Monday at the Seventh Day Adventist Church Basement from 1 to 3 p.m. Together, they've given about 250 quilts to sick and shut-in neighbors around the Hubbards area, and donated many more to organizations like the IWK Children's Hospital, Phoenix House, and the Epileptic Centre.



Their efforts rely on generous fabric donations, and with support from the Aspotogan Heritage Trust, they're able to keep buying thread and batting. Patchwork Pals also contribute quilts to local auctions and events, and always welcome new volunteers—especially those willing to sew or cut squares. The group pauses meeting during summer but continues piecing and prepping quilts behind the scenes.
